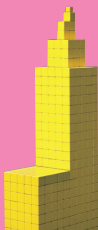

FARET TACHIKAWA | Tachikawa



There is a district in front of JR Tachikawa Station with uniquely designed objects on display. These artworks placed in public spaces such as streets and parks are referred to as public art. While these artworks may at first seem to lack practicality, they also function components of town facilities. The "FARET TACHIKAWA Art Project" involves the town of Tachikawa and has even been mentioned in textbooks. Through this project, art production has been included in elementary school curriculums and it also works with public volunteer organizations for cleaning and repair activities. The name FARET comes from the Italian word "fare", which means "to create".
