



A "honjin" was a special inn for high-ranking guest during the Edo period, and this is the only one of its kinc that remains in Tokyo. it hosted a dojo of the Tennner Rishinryu sword school where members of the Shinsengumi practiced. Famous members met and trained at this very place. There are also archive museums and historic landmarks relating to the core members who are from the area of Hino.
