A "honjin" was a special inn for high-ranking guests during the Edo period, and this is the only one of its kind that remains in Tokyo. It hosted a dojo of the Tennen Rishinryu sword school where members of the Shinsengumi practiced. Famous members met and trained at this very place. There are also archive museums and historic landmarks relating to the core members who are from the area of Hino.

In a time of rapid modernization, the members of the Shinsengumi fought against their enemies the old way with swords, and they upheld their values until the very end. The stories of the Shinsengumi have become a legend, and their many admirers visit Hino-shuku.
