Kodaira

The largest round post box in Japan

The symbol of Kodaira, the town of "round post boxes". The giant post box is approximately 2.8m tall and functions normally as a receptacle to mail things.

Fuchu

Dou Dou Hiroba

A public art display of energetic children running around the square.

Hachioji

Ryohoji Temple

Dubbed the "Moe" (slang for endearing) Temple for the cute anime characters on its signboard. A famous spot that has also appeared in various media.

Tachikawa

Neko-Gaeshi Shrine (Azusamiten Shrine)

It acquired its name from an incident where the musician Yosuke Yamashita prayed to find his lost cat, and his cat returned to him.
