Daigaku-dori Street

Around 160 cherry blossom trees stand along the sides of the street, offering a brilliant view of cherry blossoms from late March until early April.

Kitayama Park Shobuen Iris Garden

A magnificent garden with approximately 8,000 blooming Iris flowers in 300 varieties. The "Iris Festival" is held every year between early and mid-June.

Shiofune Kannonji Temple

Around 20,000 azaleas bloom each year from mid-April to early May, coloring the entire precinct of the temple in red.

Tokyo Tama is surrounded by rich nature at various locations that offer beautiful scenery throughout the year. The west Tama area is known for its beautiful mountains and streams. The Hatonosu Valley is also famous for its colorful autumn displays and the melodious upstream Tama River,

Negaramimae Suiden Rice Paddy

A total of 400,000 tulips in 60 varieties bloom from mid to late April, making for a brilliant display of vibrantly colorful flowers.

Minamisawa Aijisai Mountain

Hydrangeas covering the slopes of this mountain each year between mid-June and early July are over 10,000 hydrangeas, attracting visitors both local and international.

Plum blossom viewing sights that are being revived

The Yoshino Baigo Plum Village is one of the most famous plum blossom viewing spots in Tokyo. Within the grounds is the Ome-shi Plum Park, which served as the symbol of the plum village. In 2009, however, it was discovered that the plum trees had been infected by a virus and in 5 years they were all cut down. Restoration efforts are currently.
