Nippara Limestone Cave

This is a limestone-cave extending for 1,270m with an elevation of 134m. Inside the cave are stalactites and stalagmites.

Chikurin Park

Around 2,000 lush, Moso bamboo plants grow in this park. The spring source of the Ochiai River can also be viewed in an area within the park grounds.

Fujimi Terrace

The "diamond Fuji" , where the sun sets on the peak of Mt. Fuji, can be viewed before and after the winter solstice.

Hossawa Falls

One of the "One Hundred Waterfalls of Japan". It is a remarkable fall with a 62m drop and 4 steps. The frozen state of the water in winter is also famous.
