









There are many zoos with a warm, welcoming atmosphere that have been open

since the Showa period in the Tama area. Tama Zoological Park is the most famous among them as it has been putting effort into protecting and breeding rare animals. The zoo is four times as large as Ueno Zoo, one of the largest in the country. Over 300 types of animals are kept in their natural habitats, so visitors can to observe them in a more natural state. The "skywalk" is a popular attraction where the zoo's popular orangutans walk across a 150m rope (closed during winter / rain), while the koalas and cheetahs are also very popular.
