# **Ridge Trail**

Yomogi-no-atama

A ridge line path with a quiet view of bustling Tokyo.

#### Mt. Nanatsuishi

Beautiful, enormous rocks and a view of the mountain ridge. Nanatsuishi Shrine

Nanatsuishi Kova (hut)

At 2.017 meters, Mt. Kumotori's summit is the highest point in Tokyo, one of the biggest metropolises in the world. One interpretation of its name is "cloud catcher"; a similarly named and similarly misty spot exists on the Kumano Kodo pilgrimage route on Kii Peninsula to the distant southwest, From Mt.

Kumotori, you can see sacred Mt. Fuii rising above a sea of lower peaks, a view afforded only to those to reach the summit.



# Mt. Kumotori Safe Ascent

5 and a half-hr climb, 4-hr descent ※It requires two days one night trip plan for climbing.

35 min. from JR Okutama Station (Ome Line) on the Nishi-Tokyo Bus bound for Kamosawa Nishi or Tamba. Get off at Kamosawa Bus Stop.
