1, Tamagawa Aqueduct

Built at the start of the Edo period by Kyodai Tamagawa, this open canal supplied the castle town with drinking water. The canal spans a total length of approximately 43 km

from Hamura to Yotsuya. A walking path follows the canal in Mitaka City.

2. Osamu Dazai Literary Salon

Famed writer Dazai Osamu relocated to Mitaka for around seven years. This facility displays precious artefacts, including Osamu's handwritten manuscripts, first edition books, and more,


