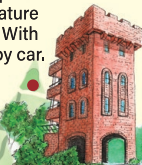
INFORMATION

- 📍 36 minutes from Shinjuku Station take the JR Chuō Line Rapid bound for Takao, get off at Tachikawa Station, and take the Tachikawa Bus for Hakonegasaki for 50 minutes, get off at Mine bus stop and walk about 15 minutes

### Miyanoiiri & Maruyama

In the deciduous forests you can enjoy the rich wildlife, including wild birds and wildflowers, that is unique to forested areas.



### Rokudōyama Park Observation Tower

A 13-meter high observatory at 192 meters above sea level. You can see a large 360-degree panorama including Mt. Fuji, the Chichibu Mountains, and the skyscrapers in Shinjuku.

### Satoyama Folk-house



Offering various events to experience the Satoyama, centered around the omoya of newly built and restored Edo period thatched folk-houses.

### Kishi Rice Paddy

Rice fields where glutinous rice and ancient rice are cultivated. Nostalgic satoyama landscapes with streams, reservoirs and fields.



### Asian Fawnlily Fields

In the inner recesses of Noyamakita Park, covering 700 square meters on the southern slope, grow 20,000 Asian Fawnlily flowers. Viewable from early April.
