

The Sayama hills, where the original scenery of the mountain woodlands persist to this day. The "Green island" floating within the city is an oasis where many animals and plants live. If you look closely, listen carefully and walk through the forest, you'll find impressive encounters with wildlife within.



Located at the western end of the Savama Hills lies Noyamakita & Rokudoyama Park, Pick up the highlights of a city park where abundant nature remains. Get around on foot or by bicycle. With plenty of parking it's also easy to go around by car.

## Mivanoiri & Nishimori

Inside this forest of deciduous trees, insects including beetles, wild birds such as pheasants and owls, and valuable wild grasses make their home here.

36 minutes from Shiniuku Station take the JR Chuö Line Rapid bound for Takao. get off at Tachikawa Station, and take the Tachikawa Bus for Hakonegasaki for 8minutes, get off at Mine bus stop and walk about 15 minutes

## Asian Fawnlily Fields

In the inner recesses of Novamakita Park, covering 700 square meters on the southern slope, grow 20,000 Asian Fawnlily flowers, Viewable from early April.



## Rokudōyama Park Observation Tower

A 13-meter high observatory at 192 meters above sea level. You can see a large 360-degree panorama including Mt. Fuii

the Chichibu Mountains, and the skyscrapers in Shiniuku.
