To the Railway Museum In Tokyo TAMA

There are three train museums in Tokyo TAMA where you can see, play and learn. Experience the rails as they used to be, as we guide you through the famous vehicles of the past.



2 ED16 Type Electric Locomotive



since 1931

A culturally important vehicle that laid the foundation for domestic production of electric locomotives.

2 D51 Type Steam Locomotive



since 1936

Nicknamed "Degoichi" and synonymous with trains. The number of locomotives manufactured here is the largest in Japan.

1 Keio Line 2010 Series



since 1959

Featuring two front windows and a green body. These carriages are often nicknamed green cars, e.g. Keio green.

1 Keio Inokashira Line 3000 Series



since 1962

Keio Electric Railway's first all-stainless vehicle. It was painted in 7 colors for each line.

1 Keio Line 5000 Series (the 1st generation)



since 1963

The 5000 series final car. Debuted as the first air-conditioned carriage as a commuter train in the Kanto region.

3 951 Series Test train



since 1969

Developed as a successor to the 0 series, it recorded the world's highest speed for a train in 1972.

1 Keio Rail-Land



A train theme park operated by Keio Electric Railway. In addition to the exhibits of famous vehicles of the past, there are also hands-on exhibits such as mini trains and driving simulators.

An outdoor exhibition of 10 real cars that tell the history of railways, from steam locomotives to bullet trains. There is also a memorial hall where you can learn with a model of the railway.
