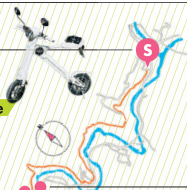


All you need is a moped or driver's license. Anyone can feel free to take a spin.

Abandoned Railway Trace



A steel bridge serves as a trace of the abandoned Mizune Freight Line, built to construct the dam.



Sakai no Seisen



Enjoy the abundant spring water, one of the 57 famous springs of Tokyo, taking in the wasabi field.

Shirahige Shrine



A shrine that rests along the Okutama Mukashi Road. The overhanging giant stone is a true masterpiece.

Irohakaede Giant Tree



Built 200 years ago, Kaede stands on a cliff. During the fall foliage, it is an eye-catching presence.

Arrival at the destination. With enough battery power on your bike, go a ways along the lakeside.

A suspension bridge spanning over 67m. Look down upon the wild Sodake Valley from atop the bridge.

A local secret/Three Waterfalls of Unazawa Hike

Unazawa Mitaki has three waterfalls: Mitsugamano Falls, Nejire Falls, and Otaki. It would take about 2 hours on foot from Okutama station. On your electric bike, though, you can easily access secluded sights where no bus service goes. So, stop your bike and go for a hike.
