Savama Park Ranger Mr. Sugivama

Aogera

It features olive-colored wings and red cheeks. Its strong beak easily makes holes in trees to build nests and search for food. The distinctive "pyo pyo" cry is unmistakable.

Aseason All year around

Odifficulty 4

Enaga

A cute little bird with long tail feathers, round eyes and a short beak that flies around the trees looking for small insects. The triple trill "eez-eez-eez" is it's main call.

season All year Odifficulty 2

Kabuto-mushi

In the bright hours, it digs into the roots to rest. In the evening, it gathers in the sap of oak. Their forked horn refers to samurai helmets and lifts opponents to throw them.

season Jun.-Aug. Odifficulty 3



The red "banded darter" dragonfly has a dark brown band on the wings. It can be seen hovering about in tall Japanese pampas grass colonies, phragmites, ponds and rice fields.

Season Jun.-Nov. Odifficulty 3

Nihon-Aka-Gaeru

This chamaeleon-like frog spends time in thickets and likes the foothills where eggs gather in the waterways and reservoirs of rice fields from February to March.

season Jan.-Mar. Odifficulty 5



Higashi-Nihon-Tokage

This chamaeleon-like frog spends time in thickets and likes the foothills where eggs gather in the waterways and reservoirs of rice fields from February to March.

season Apr.-Oct. Odifficulty 2



Uranami Akashijimi

Theclinae "gossamer-winged" butterflies that like bright well-maintained thickets. The orange and black leopard pattern is the height of diaphanous fashion.

season Jun.-Jul. Odifficulty 4

Harabiro Kamakiri

As the name suggests, it has a wide abdomen. On trunks and branches, cicadas, dragonflies and such are the prey to this praying mantis. It also hunts where wildflowers bloom.
